this is the home of the Iberian Ibex. There are 4 huntable subspecies: the Beceite, Gredos, Ronda & Sierra Nevada Ibex. We have been offering these very successful hunts for many years and we are proud to say that all our hunters have been successful. You

too can enjoy wonderful hunting days combined with the Mediterranean way of life. Since the Iberian ibexes often differ only in nuances, we have compiled extensive information material about the hunting country Spain. Here are our offers for all ibexes:



Beceite-Ibex

This subspecies is highly sought after and lives in the mountain range of the same name in eastern Spain near the Mediterranean coast. It is the strongest subspecies in terms of game weight and has the darkest cover of all Spanish ibexes. In terms of horn length, the Beceite can be compared to the Gredos ibex. Unlike the Gredos ibex, the horns grow straight and spiral outward. Characteristic for this species is

the constant horn circumference up to the middle third, which tapers only insignificantly up to the tip. The Beceite ibex can be hunted from Oct. 15 to May 31. Thanks to strict Spanish conservation regulations, populations have increased so much in the past 20 years that even spoiled hunters can choose 'their ibex'. The mountains of Beceite (a mountain range in eastern Spain, on the Mediterranean coast) are easily accessible and suitable for the less fit hunter.

Hunt on Sierra Nevada - Ibex (Season: October till April)

3 nights, 2 hunting days, accommodation (double room) in country hotels and paradors, hunting guide 1:1, transfer in the hunting area, transfer from the airport to the hunting area h/z, field preparation of the trophy, English speaking guide, incl. hunting of a **Sierra Nevada ibex without trophy limit**

The **Sierra Nevada ibex** - or Grenada ibex - is the fourth huntable species of Iberian ibex. It lives in the mountain ranges of the Sierra Nevada (southern Spain, near the city of Malaga) in a relatively large range. This subspecies in particular has a wide variety of horn shapes. In game, it is somewhat weaker than the Ibex from the Gredos and Beceite, but heavier

than those from the Ronda Mountains. The blanket color is usually medium brown, but even here there are variations into lighter or darker. Horn lengths of up to 88 cm have been measured in top trophies, but the average should be about 70 cm to 75 cm. This subspecies can be hunted from October 1 to April 30.

Hunt on Ronda - Ibex (Season: October to 15.April)

The smallest species is the **Ronda ibex**. This population lives in southern Spain in a mountain range of the same name. The mountains are not as high as in the other mountains of Spain and therefore especially suitable for those hunters who are no longer so 'good on the runs'. Even if the length of the horns rarely exceeds 68 cm, this subspecies is very popular with German hunters. Because the Ronda ibex resembles in the horn form most the all around

known Alpine ibex (even if in smaller dimensions). The cover is mostly light brown in color and it is a fantastic sight to see an 'old man's pack' in front of you. For all Spanish species it is true: thanks to the strict protection regulations and thanks to the high status - even the Spanish king is a passionate ibex hunter - all populations are so good that you will get a shot with probability bordering on certainty. Hunting season is from October 1 to April 15.



Gredos-Ibex

In central Spain, west of the capital Madrid, in the provinces of Avial, Toledo and Cacerres are the picturesque mountains of the Gredos. The highest mountain is Pico Almanzor at 2,592 meters. Here the Gredos ibex is hunted, one of the best known subspecies. The Ibex grow up to about 80 kg and the horns, measured up to the turn after, 95 cm long. Impressive also the horn base, which can be up to 28 cm for top trophies. Ornamental bulges, similar as we know them from the bezoars or the Siberian ibexes, are not or only hardly present. The cross section of a horn resembles a triangle. The horn shapes, as in all bovids, are not as varied as in deer or roe deer. As a rule, the horns have a lyre shape.

Unlike the lyre shape of cervids (e.g., roe deer), the horns of the Gredos ibex grow upward from the base before curving to the side after the first third to turn back and upward again in the last third. After the ibexes of the Beceite Mountains, the Gredos subspecies is the second most powerful subspecies in terms of weight. For the avid ibex hunter, this is an impressive trophy to have in your collection. Ibex are day game, the populations are high, the stalking guides are experienced and therefore two or three hunting days are usually enough to get you to the shot. You can hunt the Gredos ibex from September 1st to May 31st. During the whole period you will have the best chances. So you can plan your trip according to your schedule.

Because of the proximity to Germany (some people shy away from hunting in Kazakhstan or Kyrgyzstan), affordable prices and easy travel with weapons (Spain is part of the European Union), ibex hunts are becoming more and more popular. Especially since you can hunt four different species of, capra pyrenaica' in four different charming areas of this interesting hunting country. Rock deer is mountain game, there is no arguing that away. But all the mountains of Spain are, as far as they are the habitat of the ibex, easily accessible. So you don't need to be an alpinist, a normal physical condition is enough. And there is another important point in favor of Spain. Time is a valuable commodity in our hectic society. And since the ibex hunts, including outward and return flights, only last 4 days and you can also include the weekend, you only have to sacrifice a small amount of vacation time. But believe us, it is worth it. To describe the individual mountains is hardly possible and would blow up the place of this information brochure. You have to see the magnificent landscapes yourself, you have to have been stalking there to be able to reproduce the beauties of these regions.

The hunt has a high value in Spain - King Juan Carlos himself likes to hunt a lot - and accordingly the hunter is highly regarded, unlike in some parts of our country. In addition, there is the Mediterranean way of life, everything is seen in a much more relaxed way. And nevertheless the success rates with these ibex hunts are very high and rarely that times a hunter as 'tailor' comes home. But then in the hunt protocol will surely stand: ... many misses ! For hunting ibex we recommend calibers in the upper power range such as 6.5 x 68, 8 x 68 S and all calibers from the .300 group e.g. (Winchester or Weatherby). Our domestic and common shell game calibers such as .308, .30-06 and 7 x 64 quickly reach their limits at shooting distances of over 200 yards. Once you have shot your ibex, talk to your stalking guide about how the trophy should be handled. Do you want a head - shoulder preparation or are you only interested in the horn and skull? Your Spanish guide will make sure that everything is prepared smoothly. The trophy transport within the EU is problem-free, many hunters therefore have the preparations made in Spain. We will be happy to advise you and give you valuable tips.
